Destiny Empowered Women: Embrace Your Divine Calling with Courage and Clarity

"To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to sit with Me on My throne, just as I was victorious and sat down with My Father on His throne." (Revelation 3:21)

I. Your Destiny

- A. Your Destiny Throne: Reigning as an active participant.
 - 1. We're not only called to a destiny, but also to rule alongside Christ in spiritual authority.
 - Genesis: Not only the book of beginnings in the Bible, it's also the origin of our divine purpose and is not a product of chance or coincidence. (Psalm 139:13–14)
- B. Your Destiny Scroll: God's written plan and purpose for your life.
 (Psalm 139:16)
- C. **Destiny's Call:** It's preordained, not an afterthought. It's an invitation from God to align yourself with His will and to fulfill the great works He has prepared for you in advance. (Ephesians 2:10)

II. Your Battle

A. **Battle of the mind:** Where spiritual battles take place as the epicenter of our thoughts, emotions, and decisions. (2 Corinthians 10:3–5)

- B. **Arise and shine:** More than a motivational phrase, it's a divine mandate calling us out of spiritual lethargy and into the light of God's glory. (Isaiah 60:1)
- C. **Awaken and be radiant:** A continuous journey of shaking off spiritual slumber, pushing past complacency, and stepping into the light of God's purpose. (Isaiah 52:1)
- D. **Fire in your yes!** Your fire is a deep-seated passion, a burning desire to fulfill God's will and an unyielding faith that refuses to be extinguished, whatever the challenges. (Hebrews 12:29)

III. Your Restoration

- A. **Restoring the soul:** It makes you fearless and free. Perfect love casts out all fear.
 - 1. The soul: The very essence of our being, craves restoration and rejuvenation. Our souls long for God's refreshing touch.
 - 2. The Scriptures: the place we can go to gain solace and strength from its timeless wisdom in our times of vulnerability. (Psalm 23:3)
 - 3. To be fearless: To confront and conquer our fears. To be free is to live unburdened by them. (2 Timothy 1:7)
 - 4. "Fearless and free": The state of being unburdened by fear and fully embracing the freedom that comes from a relationship with Christ. (Romans 8:15)
- B. **Armed for war:** Our spiritual journey is a battle, requiring armor and weaponry—God's armor. (Ephesians 6:11)
- C. **Resolve to reign.** Exercise your authority and dominion as believers. You are called to reign in life
 - 1. It's a godly stewardship of the influence and resources entrusted to you.
 - 2. This involves making decisions that align with God's will, leading with wisdom, and impacting our spheres of influence for His glory.
 - 3. We are of royal heritage. Therefore, we are to live in a manner befitting our regal status. (1 Peter 2:9)

IV. Getting Started

- A. **Dare to dream.** Dreams are the blueprints of our destiny:
 - 1. Our dreams are God-given glimpses into what is possible when we align ourselves with God's purpose. (Ephesians 3:20)
 - 2. Our dreams, however grand or audacious, are within reach when we anchor them in God's power.
 - 3. Daring to dream is to embrace the limitless potential placed within us: To challenge the status quo, and to envision a future where we are fully walking in our divine assignment.

B. Embrace your destiny with courage and clarity.

- 1. Courage: The boldness to step into the unknown, to face challenges and obstacles without fear. (Joshua 1:9)
- Clarity involves having a clear understanding and vision of our destiny. (Proverbs 29:18)
- C. **Courage for commitment:** In context of our destiny, courage refers to a deepseated conviction to remain steadfast in our divine calling in the midst of challenging times.
 - 1. This courage is intimately intertwined with our commitment to God's purpose for our lives. The Bible showcases figures who displayed unwavering commitment in challenging times.
 - 2. A covenantal relationship with God, akin to a sacred vow, empowers us to push beyond our fears and uncertainties. (Joshua 1:9)
 - 3. Courage: Not merely the absence of fear, but also the determination to press forward despite it.
 - a. We derive our strength from the One who has charted our path.
 - b. Remember: courage is a choice, a choice that propels us into the fulness of our God-given destiny.

- 4. Commitment: A strong dedication or pledge to a particular cause, task, relationship, or objective.
- 5. Clarity: The lens through which we view our destiny. It's not about having all the answers, but about trusting in the One who does. When we lean into God's wisdom, He provides the clarity we need. (Proverbs 3:5–6)

D. Write your vision / destiny and make it plain. (Habakkuk 2:2)

- 1. This biblical mandate underscores the importance of having a clear vision for our destiny and documenting it.
- 2. A lucid vision becomes a roadmap that guides us toward our divine purpose, serving as a constant reminder, especially in times of doubt or confusion.
- 3. Writing down the vision brings it from the abstract realm into the tangible world, giving it substance, helping keep us focused and aligned with our destiny.
- E. In spite of the opposition, we'll have wings like eagles!
 - 1. Eagles, majestic creatures of the sky, symbolize strength, vision, and resilience.
 - 2. They can soar to great heights even in the face of storms, a powerful metaphor for believers.
 - 3. A believer's challenges and adversities are akin to the turbulent winds an eagle encounters. Just as an eagle rises above the tempest, we too can ascend to greater spiritual heights, drawing our hope from the Lord. (Isaiah 40:31)

V. The End Result

A. **A crown of honor.** Every individual holds a unique place of honor within God's creation. This symbolizes our intrinsic worth and dignity as cherished children of God. He views us not through the lens of our shortcomings, but as redeemed sons graced with beauty and honor.

- B. **A crown of humility** recognizes that our gifts, talents, and destiny are not for our glory but for God's, serving others and being a vessel through which God's love and grace can flow. (James 4:10)
- C. **A legacy of faith,** without which we cannot please God.
- D. **Anointing for our assignment:** A heavenly seal that signifies God's appointment for a specific purpose. (Isaiah 61; Luke 4:18)

VI. Who Is a Destiny-Empowered Woman?

- A. She is a Kingdom heir.
 - 1. She has fully embraced her God-given purpose and is actively pursuing her destiny with passion and determination.
 - 2. She is guided by the wisdom and strength that comes from a deep relationship with Christ. (Proverbs 31:25)
 - 3. She is strong, dignified, and confident in her future: She knows her destiny is aligned with God's plan for her life.
 - 4. She impacts her world positively using her gifts, talents, and experiences to make a difference in the lives of others.
 - 5. She is divinely empowered for good works and great exploits with God. (Ephesians 2:6)
 - 6. She does not walk aimlessly. She is eternally focused, investing in a legacy that will echo through eternity.
 - 7. She seeks first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and decrees justice wherever there is injustice.
- B. She is one who works at modeling. (2 Peter 2:10, Proverbs 6:16–19)
- C. Conclusion: Your Destiny Matters!
 - 1. Your destiny is not just about self-fulfillment. It's tied to a higher commission, a divine mandate. (Matthew 28:19–20)
 - 2. As destiny-empowered women, we are called to spread the message of God's love, grace, and redemption. We are ambassadors and Kingdom warriors for Christ, representing His Kingdom on earth.

- 3. Commitment to this commission requires us to be steadfast, resilient, and unwavering in our faith.
- 4. The Holy Spirit guides us, equipping and empowering us for every challenge. Through us He shines brightly, drawing many from darkness to light. (Acts 1:8)
- 5. We are not just called, we are also chosen to make a difference. We are a lighthouse of hope, positively influencing our surroundings—led not just by a purpose but by the Holy Spirit, fully yielded to the Lordship of Jesus Christ.
